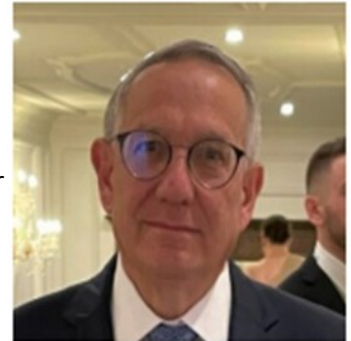

A Summer of Self-Study

It occurred to me that, with the summer upon us and our adult education classes taking a respite, I would like to recommend an avenue for self-study for the members of our congregation. As most of you may know, the book we use each Shabbat during the reading of the Torah, the Eitz Hayim Humash can be a wonderful summer companion if you wish to learn something new this summer about our faith and tradition. While the volume presents a clear and comprehensible translation to each and every portion within the Five Books of Moses, there is a well-spring of resources that can be found as well along with an ample set of distinguished essays at the conclusion of the volume. I wanted to briefly describe its contents to you.



Following the Hebrew text and English translation there is a section of commentary that is called the P'shat Commentary. The P'shat of a text is often translated as its simple meaning. The scholars assembled here to comment on our text use archaeology, philology, anthropology, along with a new awareness of ancient cultures to put the Torah in its proper context. All of these resources add to our knowledge of the biblical worlds and its surroundings. We see our people in the flow of time in history, participating alongside civilizations around them, yet with their own perspectives. What they gave to the ancient world and what they took from it are firmly embedded in the P'shat, the plain and simple meaning of the text.

A second section below the P'shat commentary is called the Derash Commentary. The Hebrew word, derash means to inquire or to investigate. It is the traditional non-literal way that we read and understand sacred texts. It provides us with a dazzling array of ideas and homiletical insights to enrich our understanding of the text and to allow us to relate the Torah to our world today. One great scholar of Torah, Jacob Petuchowski said, "Jews read Torah as one reads a love letter, eager to squeeze the meaning out of every single word." We search for insights that go beyond the plain meaning of the words. Why was one word used instead of another? What might be the significance of the repetition of certain words? And what does the choice of a word reveal about the speaker's innermost thoughts? All of these thoughts go into the formation of this extremely useful commentary.

Finally, there is a section on many of the Biblical passages titled, "Halakha l'Maa-seh" the practice and observance of Jewish law as it applies to daily life/personal relations/business practices/religious observances/social policy/acts of social conscience. This section enables us to see how Jewish law has evolved over time from biblical origins to rabbinic traditions to our most recent practices. In our book the Conservative movement takes center stage in the explanations found there.

The summer months can provide us with additional time to fully acquaint ourselves with our tradition, and the Eitz Hayim Humash can be the perfect summer companion. Think about purchasing a volume for yourself or spending some time in our sanctuary using our books. In this way you can be assured that you will be spending your summer months wisely.

Rabbi Mishkin, Congregants, and Fellow Board Members,

On Wednesday evening, May 22, the Congregation voted unanimously for the new Slate of Officers. I wish a Toda Raba to the outgoing Treasurer, Ken Deitz, who served on the Executive Board, and Lee Hyman, the Communications Chair on the Regular Board, for your volunteer commitment this past year.

For the new Slate of Officers, I am thrilled that Allan Benish is returning to the Executive Board as the Treasurer. Allan participated in many functions this past year, including the Journal Brunch, as the Treasurer for two months and hiring new Personnel. For the new Board, Roberta Karpel stepped down as 3rd Vice President but agreed to take over as Fund-raising Chair. Linda Benish, who held two critical positions on the Board last year, will continue as our Programming and Adult Education Chair. My wife, Harriet Rabinowitz, will take over as Communications Chair, and spent many hours constructing Beth Ohr's new website.

I am thankful to all the Board members who will continue in the same Board positions as last year: Marty Israel, Myles Schwartz, Helene Grynberg and Allen Skupp on the Executive Board, and Stu Rizick, Mel Brandl, Chuck Rogol, and Paula Yourman on the Regular Board. We have 1 opening available for Membership Chair, as Irv Jankovitz has volunteered to serve as the Third Vice President.

In the past year, my Board has accomplished many things outside of the normal events:

- Engaged Cantor Zahava Fried for the High Holidays in 2023. She also visited in person for a Shabbaton in early December, and in person with her family for a Shabbaton and Fund Raising Concert last weekend. She will be joining us again for the High Holidays in 2024.
- Acquired 250 Machzors for the 2024 High Holidays.
- Hired a new Office Administrator in April.
- Built a new website for the Synagogue.
- Renegotiated a new lease with the Church who is renting our lower sanctuary on Sundays.
- Replaced the commercial oven in the main Kitchen with two residential ovens and purchased a new commercial refrigerator.
- Bought a new defibrillator for the Social Hall.
- Invested Reserve Funds into funds with higher interest rates.

My main goal this coming year is to grow membership and to improve attendance at Synagogue Services and Events. The event with Cantor Fried last weekend was very rewarding to me. It was fantastic to see Synagogue members return to the building and experience the Community spirit that Congregation Beth Ohr provides its members.

The Board has already met with our main tenant Main Street Theater regarding a renewal of their lease starting August 1, 2024. Our relationship with them continues to grow, and they are performing many functions to assist the Synagogue.

Lastly, I am excited to announce that Rabbi Mishkin has signed a new four-year contract to be our Religious leader through June 30, 2028. The main reason that we are successful is due to his strong leadership, his Jewish connections, and his outreach to our congregants, fellow Rabbis, and the greater Jewish community. We hope Beverly and Rabbi Joel will remain in our community for many years. I am proud to be your incoming President!

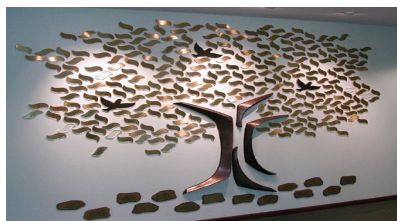
