

Our Time in Portugal by Rabbi Joel Mishkin

As some of you know, Beverly and I had the good fortune to spend nine days in Portugal during the month of July. It was our first time leaving the country since the pandemic began and we were able to travel with two of our closest friends, Rabbi Geoff and Sue Huntting, whom we have known since 1995. To put it succinctly, we had a great time.



However, of all the memorable experiences that we shared overseas, the most valuable and meaningful one was our tour through the village of Alfama, Portugal, the home of the Jewish population during the fifteenth century who became known as the Marranos. These Portuguese Jews openly converted to Christianity in order to preserve their lives in their homes, but secretly continued to practice the Jewish faith. Touring these sites with our private tour guide, Daniel Batos, was eye-opening to say the least. Daniel pointed out hidden marks signifying the place for mezuzot on the doorposts of the homes. Many homes showed off Christian crosses carved into the cement structure to display the populations' newborn commitment to Christianity. And he showed us what could have been hanging structures for plants outside of the houses, but were actually used to display Menorahs during Chanukah. Finally, Daniel told us of sausages secretly prepared with chicken and lamb parts rather than pork products. This practice cleverly fooled their Catholic neighbors into thinking that they had changed their dietary practices, while still staying Kosher.

All of this made me think about the religious opportunities that are available to us in this country today. Although we have seen a reemergence of anti-semitism, we also realize just how lucky we are that we can proudly attend our synagogues and practice our traditions and religious faith without fear or anxiety. I hope that those of you who are healthy and able will join me in-person in synagogue for the upcoming services that we will soon observe: Tisha B'Av in our sanctuary joined by members of the Marlboro Jewish Center and Temple Beth Ahm, Selichot services this year at Temple Beth Ahm in Aberdeen, and of course, our vibrant High Holiday services that will once again feature Cantor Zahava Fried. What better way to celebrate your Jewish heritage and faith over the next several months.


