## Elias "Al" Engber

January 19, 1933 - January 4, 2025

*Brief personal history written by Al on March 10, 2020*

My name is Elias Engber. I was born in the town of Chambas in the providence of Camagüey, Cuba on January 19, 1933. This was a very small town in the middle of the island.

My school was small; only one room with the same teacher for all. There was no name on the street, only landmarks used for giving directions. One must try to think about that in the 1930s we had electricity only 2 to 3 hours a day. There was also only one main

street where all the businesses were like a bodega, drug store and my father's dry goods store (clothing, shoes, etc.). We lived behind the store and we had an ice box. Someone from another town came and sold ice for it.

As a kid I went fishing with my friends and sometimes went with them to the train station for sugar cane and always found someone to help strip off the bark. We were all poor but no one realized it because we all had about the same things. We played a game like marbles except we used caps from soda bottles filled with clay to shoot instead of glass marbles.

When I was 12 years old I went to live with my uncle in Havana so I could study for my Bar Mitzvah. In 1946 after studying with a Rabbi I made it with my whole family there to share in this proud day.

When I was living in Havana I saw for the first time a bus, a trolley car, movie theatres, big stores. "WOW!"

In 1948 the entire family moved to Havana where my father opened a factory and manufactured alligator pocketbooks, wallets and belts. Most of his business was exporting to America.

In 1955, amongst the turmoil of the Batista regime and the fighting and unrest, my father thought it best to leave Cuba for America as soon as possible.

Later on [1959] we read Batista was out and Castro was in. The rest is history.

## Pitfalls to *Avoid* when Planning Your Estate

People usually want their affairs settled without problems or delays, especially the heirs. Yet many problems develop unwittingly even when people are fully prepared and take every precaution. Further, some people engage in actions they feel will make things go smoothly when all they are doing is creating extra work for themselves. Pitfalls abound everywhere. This program will cover some of the more common problems people have settling estates and even avoiding difficulties while they are still around. Everyone attending this program should leave it with at least one change (and probably many) they will make to assure an easier handling of what is usually an upsetting process during a very unsettled period.

### Brief bio:

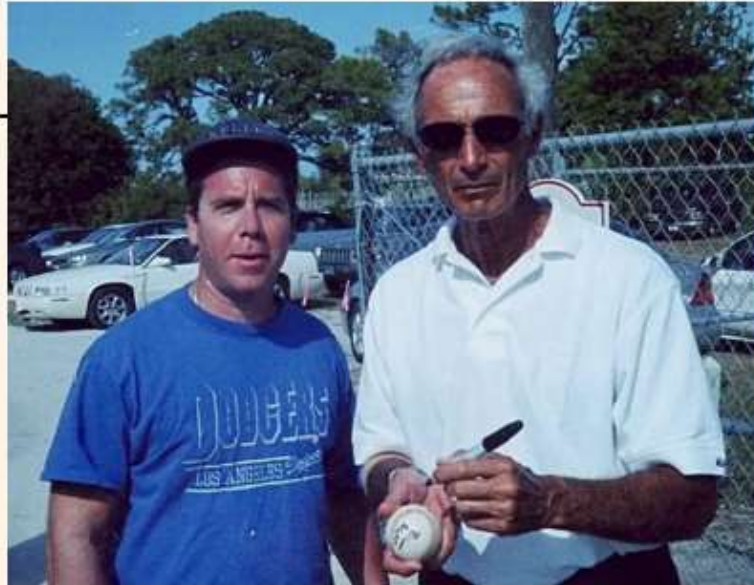
