Coming Home

As all of you know I am returning to our congregation beginning March 1st for the Shabbat morning service. It occurred to me that this four-week or so period has been the longest time that I've been away from Shul since coming to Old Bridge. I was grateful that I was given the time to heal and while I'm not quite what I was before surgery, I am feeling infinitely better than those first ten days after my operation.



I also have learned some very important lessons since this was the first time that I had a surgical procedure which required hospitalization. It gave me a real perspective of what it means to not feel well and how challenging that can be and how difficult it is to focus on others when you yourself are in pain. The uncertainty and anxiety that we all feel when we are not well is something that I have been pretty much spared from throughout my life, and so, this experience, hopefully, will enhance the way that I attempt to provide you with comfort during hospital visitations and other difficult times in the coming years. I recently joked with one of our members that when I first came to Old Bridge I had a primary physician and an eye doctor. Today, ten years later, like many of you, I have collected a few more physicians and specialists and am now comparing notes with some of you far more often than when I first became your rabbi. Such is life.

I titled this brief newsletter article "Coming Home," because it really does feel like I am returning to a place of spiritual comfort as I rejoin our synagogue services. I wish to thank everyone who helped to fill the gaps during the last few weeks so that everything ran smoothly and without a hitch.

Finally, I hope that you will join me at services in-person and via zoom in the coming weeks as we all begin to prepare for both Purim and Passover. We really are blessed to be a part of a community of folks who really care about each other and who try as much as we can to look after each other. This, above all, is what a synagogue is truly all about. Thank you for your understanding and good wishes and I'll see you in Shul!

Parsha Mishpatim

Shabbat Shalom. Today we recite Parsha Mishpatim, the sixth Parsha in the Book of Exodus. In recent years, this Shabbat has become known as Repro Shabbat. This year, Women's League for Conservative Judaism, an organization that our Sisterhood is a member of, is partnering with National Council of Jewish Women, to support reproductive freedom.

Repro Shabbat is an annual Shabbat celebration that honors the Jewish value of reproductive freedom. It takes place annually on *Parshat Mishpatim*, which contains the verses commonly referenced as the foundation of Judaism's approach to reproductive health, rights, and justice. Individuals and communities across the world gather to celebrate Repro Shabbat and the Jewish traditions it honors. As a past Sisterhood President and a past Synagogue President who was asked to deliver today's D'Var Torah, I chose to address these issues.

Since we recite the Triennial readings, we did not recite this Section this morning. Exodus Chapter 21, Verses 22 through 25 on pages 461 and 462 of the Etz Hayim Chumash, states:

When men fight, and one of them pushes a pregnant woman and a miscarriage results, but no other damage ensues, the one responsible shall be fined according as the woman's husband may exact from him, the payment to be based on reckoning. But if other damage ensues, the penalty shall be life for life, eye for eye, tooth for tooth, hand for hand, foot for foot, burn for burn, wound for wound, bruise for bruise.

Our Chumash quotes Halakhah L'Ma'aseh which explains Verse 22 as follows:

Applying this text to all forms of miscarriage, Jewish law requires different forms of mourning for a fetus than for someone born alive. Full mourning rites are not appropriate for a fetal loss, but the CJLS – Committee on Jewish Law and Standards -, understanding the emotional and physical pain of a couple experiencing a miscarriage, has ruled that the community should offer them support through prayer and the *mitzvah* of visiting the sick.

The continuation of this interpretation connects this Parsha with Repro Shabbat as follows:

Because the Torah demands only a monetary payment for the fetus in contrast to “life for life” for the woman, the fetus is not considered to be a full-fledged human being, and abortion is not murder. It is, however, an injury to the woman; and, as such, abortion is generally prohibited. It is allowed only to save the physical or mental health of the mother. Many authorities, including the CJLS, permit maternal anguish over the prospect of giving birth to a child with severe defects. Abortion is not permitted as a retroactive form of birth control.

When I commenced my study of this Parsha, I was familiar with its importance and the rules addressed therein but was not aware of the impact that just four verses had on our community. I intend to discuss with Sisterhood's leadership the possibility of celebrating Sisterhood Shabbat on Repro Shabbat beginning in 2026.

Thank you for the opportunity to deliver the D'Var Torah this morning. However, I would be remiss if I did not end with a special line from today's Parsha – Section 24, Verse 7 on page 478:

Then he took the record of the covenant and read it aloud to the people. And they said, “All that the Lord has spoken we will faithfully do!”

We shall faithfully obey the commandments 24/7 – all day, every day!

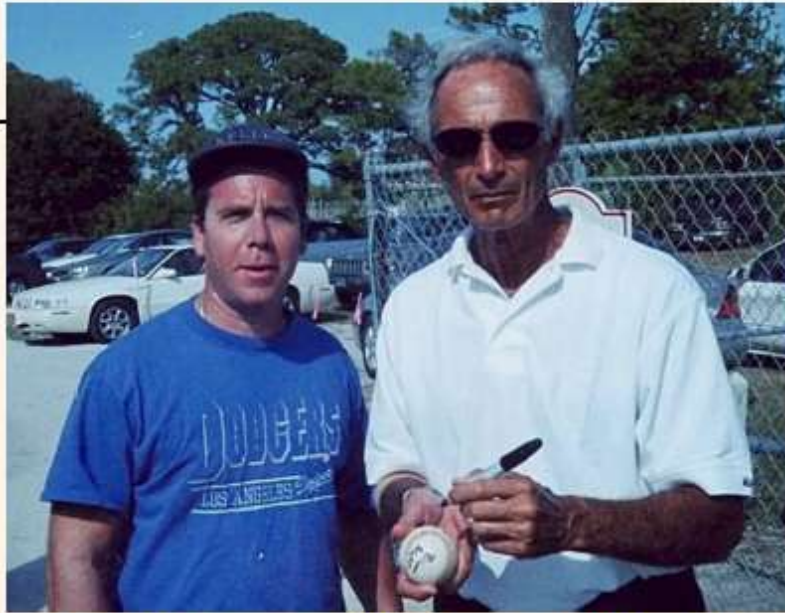
